
MONTHLY WORKSHOP REVIEW



The National Autistic Society's response to the Mental Health Bill being excluded from The King's Speech

Tim Nicholls, Head of Influencing and Research at the National Autistic Society, said: "The King's Speech was a vital opportunity for the Government to commit to reforming the outdated Mental Health Act... There are 2,045 autistic people and people with learning disabilities in mental health hospitals in England - and 65% are autistic people. Reforming the Mental Health Act needed to be a key step towards ending this crisis."
