WARNING: Scam alert!

Be aware of people offering or selling:

- Virus testing kits these are only offered by the NHS
- Vaccines or miracle cures there is currently no vaccine or cure
- Overpriced or fake goods to protect yourself from coronavirus such as antibacterial products
- Shopping or medication collection services
- Home cleaning services

Protect yourself and others:

- Don't be rushed into making a decision; if it sounds too good to be true, it probably is
- Only purchase goods from legitimate retailers and take a moment to think before parting with money or personal information

If someone claims to represent a charity, ask them for ID. Be suspicious of requests for money up front. If someone attempts to pressurise you into accepting a service they are unlikely to be genuine. Check with family and friends before accepting offers to help if you are unsure.
