Supporting People with Learning Disabilities

Referrals: We have seen some more new referrals over the past few months but fewer than we would like. We have, though, had plenty of people return to the service presenting with new difficulties in their lives.

Monthly Workshops and Drop-ins

We held a workshop to plan our series of workshops for the year based on what people wanted. This has been really useful and I would like to thank everyone who came and gave their opinions. We will be creating a programme for 2019 based around the issues that people have suggested, beginning with a First-Aid workshop in January.

Outreach

I have continued to attend the outreach sessions in Cotmandene and Mottingham on alternate Wednesdays. Spaces are first-come-first-serve and we have been getting busier (particularly in Mottingham) so I would recommend that people get there early!

I have also continued to run sessions from Bromley Jobcentre Plus on Thursday afternoons, meeting people or supporting at their appointments. If you would like to meet me there, or have an appointment you would like me to support at, please ask your work coach or advisor and they will make you an appointment with me.

I am also holding an outreach session at Community House on South Street (in central Bromley) for people who have a learning difficulty, learning disability or autistic spectrum disorder. I will be in the café one morning every week and will be able to talk over any problems you might be facing, concerns you have or to read through any letters you might want me to look at. There is no need to make an appointment, just come along and look for me!

Coffee Morning - Fridays, 10.30am-12.30pm

Immediately after the Community House drop-in, just before midday, I will be in the Community Café in Community House. This is a great opportunity for anyone who would like to meet other people with a learning difficulty, learning disability or autistic spectrum disorder. If you would like to come along, please look out for the Bromley Well table which I will keep reserved for our use.

Improving health for people with learning disabilities

Doctors in Bromley are encouraging people with learning disabilities to make sure they have their annual health check with their GP. The check helps to keep you well and pick up any problems at an early stage. In Bromley only half of those entitled to the check are actually having one. To help understand why this is and how we can encourage more people to have their annual check, the Clinical Commissioning Group are asking people to respond to a short survey. 'All my life suddenly made sense' How it feels to be diagnosed with autism late in life

Penny Andrews got her diagnosis of Asperger syndrome (though she is perfectly comfortable with the term "autistic") when she was 30. Back then, she was a regular user of LiveJournal, the social networking site, and one of her online contacts had begun to write about the process of finding out he was autistic. "He wrote about it quite openly: all the reasons he'd gone for diagnosis, what the procedure was like, seeing half a dozen different psychiatrists before he found one who would refer him for diagnosis, and the more he wrote about it, the more I was like, 'Oh, God, this is me." Autism among women and girls is only starting to be properly understood.
