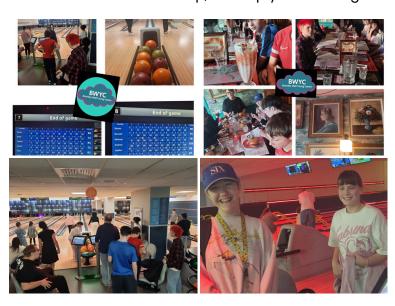
BWYC Events update

BWYC offers dedicated transition support for young carers, designed to help you navigate important life changes. Whether you're moving to a new secondary school, starting university, or planning for your future, we're here to guide and support you every step of the way.

Transition Support for Young Carers

There are grants available from the **Carers Trust Carers Grant Fund for any** carers, aged 16+. Carers can apply for grants of up to £400 for items or activities that will benefit them in their caring role. This could be for a range of things including driving lessons, help to buy items for the home giving a break from your caring role.
